Year 7 Camp is a great opportunity for students to spend time with their year group outside the school setting, get to know each other, build positive relationships and engage in a range of challenging and fun outdoor activities. Permission notes for Year 7 Camp were handed out to students on the first day of this term (28th January, 2016).

This year, our Year 7 camp will be held at Cataract Scout Park (Appin, Sydney) from **Wednesday 24th February to Friday 26th February (Week 5, Term 1)**. Students will travel to and from the camp by bus leaving from Nowra High School. Accommodation will be a combination of cabins and tents.

All meals are provided once students arrive at the centre with a cooked breakfast, morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea, dinner and supper. At the camp, students will be placed in groups and will do a variety of activities. Some of these include **giant swing, high ropes, abseiling, caving, archery, flying fox, challenge valley and orienteering**.



The cost of the camp is **\$265**, which includes accommodation, meals, activities, instructors for the duration of the camp and bus. Payment for the camp can be paid in two instalments. The first instalment is a payment of \$50 which is a non-refundable deposit and must be paid by Friday 5/2/2016 (Week 2).

Please note that the first **\$50** will be non-refundable and will finalise numbers for the camp. Payments in full will also be accepted at the front office. Please be aware **FINAL PAYMENT** needs to be submitted via the front office by the end of Week 4 (19th February 2016). Please ensure notes are carefully filled out with all information provided (including medical information). If notes are not completed correctly, notes will be sent home with students to be finalised.

This is a fun and exciting camp not to be missed so please make sure notes and deposit are handed in promptly to secure your spot.

Nowra travelled to Figtree oval to play against Smiths Hill High School, for the Hasset Cup. Nowra lost the toss and had to bowl first. Smith's Hill got off to a shaky start with most of their runs coming off edges. Just as the two openers for Smith's Hill started to look comfortable and control the crease, a devastating ball from Jared Holbrow and a sharp catch by Ritesh Baral put the pressure back on Smith's Hill. To the credit of Smith's Hill they rallied and at the halfway point they were 2 for 120. After the break the captain of Nowra High, Ryan Henry decided to take the pace out of the ball. This ended up being a pivotal decision in the game, spin from both ends slowed the run rate down. Ritesh Baral was the standout of the bowlers taking 3-35 off 8 overs. Smith's Hill set Nowra High 206 for victory.

Nowra got off to a steady start with openers Ryan Henry and Kaleb Phillips. After Ryan Henry was caught behind, Nowra lost their next three wickets for 15 runs. Jared Holbrow, Chantelle Downey and Lorcan Edwards-Villalta all played a pivotal role in the run chase occupying the crease and turning the strike over for the inform Kaleb Phillips. At the fall of the 8th wicket for 157 the game looked out of reach for Nowra High needing 49 off 42 with 2 wickets remaining. To the credit of Kaleb, he played with a mature outlook on the game and never gave up. The next over he hit 16 off it, which took some of the heat out of Smith's Hill attack. Despite Smith's Hill employing some interesting tactics to Kaleb Phillips, he still managed to control the game and with 18 balls left Nowra only needed 6 more runs with 1 wicket remaining. There was a tense moment when Nowra's number 11, Jamie Wayside was on strike and played and missed at a ball that just missed his off stump, luckily it was the end of the over. The next over Kaleb Phillips tied the game and it was down to Jamie to win the game for Nowra. He was facing their opening bowler, who bowled a shorter ball that Jamie rocked back and smashed to the boundary for a four. As soon as the ball was struck the Nowra High team rushed onto the field to celebrate the win.
