



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

School uniform

Lowes, our school uniform supplier, is located in Stocklands, Nowra and they have informed us that they will be hosting a special promotion (20 % off the price) on 12 November for all customers who have a Zero card or a Reward card. You can sign up for these cards on the promotion day if you like. This will be a wonderful opportunity for our families to prepare for the 2021 school year at a great price. It gives me great pride to see our students wearing the Nowra High uniform in the community and looking so well presented.

Evacuation on Wednesday

On Wednesday students and staff at our school were evacuated as a precaution. This was done in consultation with police after the school received certain information from an anonymous source. I was extremely proud of the way that the evacuation proceeded in an orderly fashion and without incident. At no time was any student or staff member in danger. To ensure the wellbeing of students and staff, all NSW public schools have such procedures, which are practised regularly.

After police attended the site and gave approval, students and staff returned to the school in the early afternoon. An HSC exam was disrupted by this incident, and the school is dealing separately with those students, in consultation with the NSW Education Standards Authority, which conducts the exams. If you have any concerns, please contact the school and request to speak to the Principal or the Deputy Principal who is responsible for your child's year group.

HSC Exams continuing

I would like to thank the staff and students for their flexibility as the school routine continues to adapt around the HSC examinations. The remaining examinations will be held between A block and the library. Staff and students have been working hard to give the students a quiet and calm space in which to complete their exams.

Chewing gum

Please note that chewing gum is banned at Nowra High School. This is due to the unnecessary and unhygienic manner that some students have chosen to dispose of it in the school environment. Hygiene is always a matter for public health. Particularly this year excellent standards of hygiene are essential.

Nowra Show

Nowra Show Management Committee have contacted us to say "thank you for being teachers in what has to have been one of the most challenging years". Recipe to be followed:

Chocolate Cake
 2 cups SR Flour 2 eggs 1 cup cocoa 125g butter
 1 cup sugar 2 eggs Small dash of vanilla 1 cup milk
 Pre-heat oven to 180°C. Grease a round or rectangle 8 - 9 inch cake tin with butter. SR flour, salt and cocoa 4 to 5 times into a bowl and put aside.
 In a separate bowl cream butter and sugar then add eggs and vanilla, beating well. Then gradually add flour mix and milk. Mix well and pour into cake tin.
 Bake in moderate oven 180°C for about 30 minutes. When cool, ice with chocolate icing by adding 1 cup cocoa to long mixture. Spread over cooled cake.
Chocolate Icing
 2 cups icing sugar 1 tsp melted butter (melted) 1 tsp cocoa
 Vanilla to taste Warm Water
 SR icing sugar mixture into a bowl. Add melted butter then mix spreading consistency by slowly adding warm water.
 Add vanilla and cocoa to taste.
 Add more icing sugar or water if needed to achieve desired consistency.

Hints for baking scenes for Exhibitions/Shows

First of all, read the Show Schedule thoroughly.
 Have a hot oven, know your oven.
 When cooked, brush off any excess flour, top and underneath, with pastry brush.
 To avoid flour on bottom of scenes, line the baking tray with baking paper.
 Scenes should be medium brown on top and light brown underneath.
 Sometimes it makes a difference whatever scene tray is used, for the bottom of the scenes.
 Experiment prior to Show. Scenes must be same size and shape, if possible.
 If mixture is too soft, gradually add a bit more flour. It is better to have a soft mixture and add extra flour than to have a stiff mixture and add extra liquid as this can make the top hard and the scene heavy.
 When cooked, cover with tea towel to keep the top soft.
