PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents, Carers and families,

Welcome to term 1 of 2022. I hope you all had a relaxing Christmas holiday. 2022 has already proven to provide many challenges for our school and our community as we navigate the implications of the Omicron variant of COVID-19. Thank you for your assistance with Rapid Antigen Testing at home and for providing surgical masks for your children to bring to school. Please remember to notify the school ASAP if your child receives a positive RAT or PCR test as well as through the Services NSW App.

HSC marks were released early January this year, with students from Nowra High achieving some very pleasing results. After two difficult years, I am extremely proud of this year group, demonstrating resilience in the face of adversity and a great ability to overcome the hurdles they faced. Our Year 12 students achieved excellent HSC results - 9 students achieved Band 6 results and 80 students achieved Band 5 across a variety of subjects. Congratulations go to the nine students who were placed on the Distinguished Achievers List, some of whom gained multiple Band 6 results and to the Dux of 2021 Ari Landstra who achieved an ATAR of 97.3.

Female Vocal Auditions

idition process: Auditions will occur in two parts.

1. The first session will be a performance of a piece of free choice designed to show the singer's ability, 2 mins maximum, with backing to best show the singer's pitching with an accompaniment. No costumes or props, but the audition should demonstrate a prepared performance. It need not be from the start of the selected piece. Students will be notified if they are proceeding to Session 2.

NB: Auditions will be stopped at 2 minutes - please do not be offended if your audition is stopped, this is purely to ensure all auditioned have equal time.

The second session will involve harmonising, learning a song in parts, and performing the song with choreography taught on the day. Students should have some experience of ensemble singing and ability to follow musical scores.

Stage Band Auditions

- · Positions are only available for:
 - Alto Saxophon
 - Tenor Saxophone Baritone Saxophone
 - o Trumpet o Trombone
 - Bass Guitar Drums
- Students may nominate multiple instruments, including instruments not listed above, but should clearly identify their first preference from this list.
 All performers will be expected to read standard music notation.

Applicants are required to perform a piece of free choice designed to demonstrate the performer's ability and range of style, 2 mins maximum. The audition should demonstrate a prepared performance. It need not be from the start of the selected piece. The auditionees will also be asked to perform a short sight-reading excerpt to gauge their ability

NB: Auditions will be stopped at 2 minutes - please do not be offended if your audition is stopped, this is purely to ensure all auditioned have equal time

Dance Auditions

Selection will be through a choreographed workshop taught to the students on the day by a trained choreographer. Both a jazz routine and lyrical routine will be taught at the kshop. Please wear appropriate dance attire.

Continue to self-isolate for 7 days from the day you received your positive result and follow the advice from NSW Health.





IF YOU LIVE WITH SOMEONE WHO IS COVID POSITIVE:



Self-isolate immediately

You must self-isolate for 7 days from the last time you were in contact with the COVID-positive person. This means staying away from the positive person in your household at all times.



Take a rapid antigen test (RAT)

- Take a rapid antigen test (RAT) as soon as possible and again on day 6 of isolation
- Take an additional RAT if you develop



If all tests are negative, you can e isolation after 7 days



If you test positive

- You need to isolate for 7 days from the day of your positive test result.
- Follow the Testing positive to COVID-19 and managing COVID-19 safely at home advice on the NSW Health website.



Avoid high-risk settings

Do not visit people in hospital, a nursing home or prison for the following 7 days after leaving

What do I need to do if I test positive to COVID?

Follow these steps to manage COVID-19 safely at home.





Report your rapid antigen test (RAT)

- You must register a positive test on the Service NSW app or website.
- This links you to to important health care support and advice based on your COVID-19 risk.



Isolate immediately

- For at least 7 days.
 Your household must also self-isolate for 7 days, take a RAT as soon as possible and again on day 6.



Let contacts know

- Tell people who you spent time with 2 days before you started having symptoms or you tested positive (whichever came first) that you have COVID-19.
- . This includes your social contacts, workplace and/or school.

Monitor your symptoms

- If you are concerned you should call your GP, the NSW Health COVID-19 Care at Home Support Line on 1800 960 933 or the National Coronavirus Helpline on 1800 020 080. Call 000 for an ambulance if symptoms become severe.
